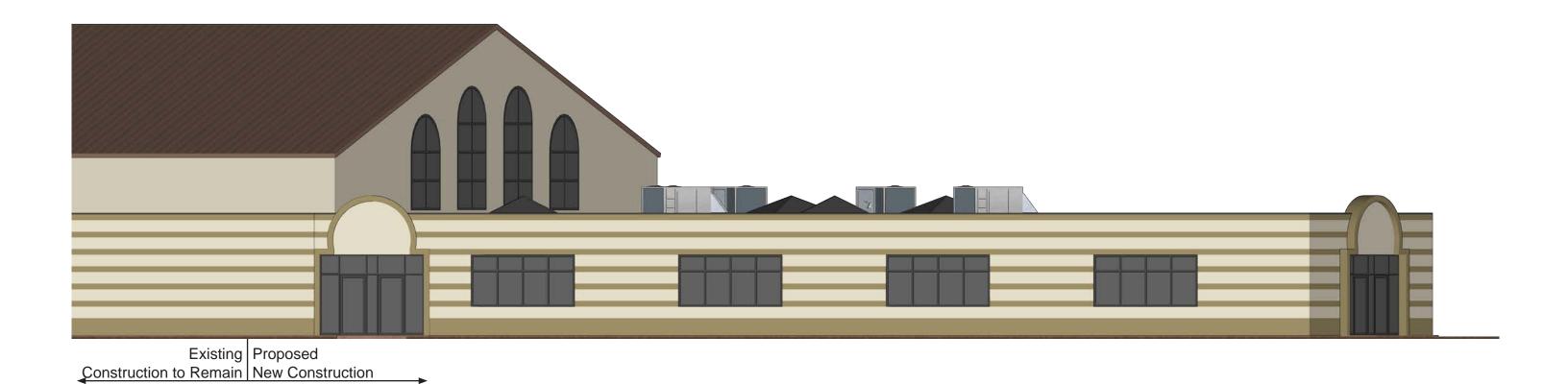

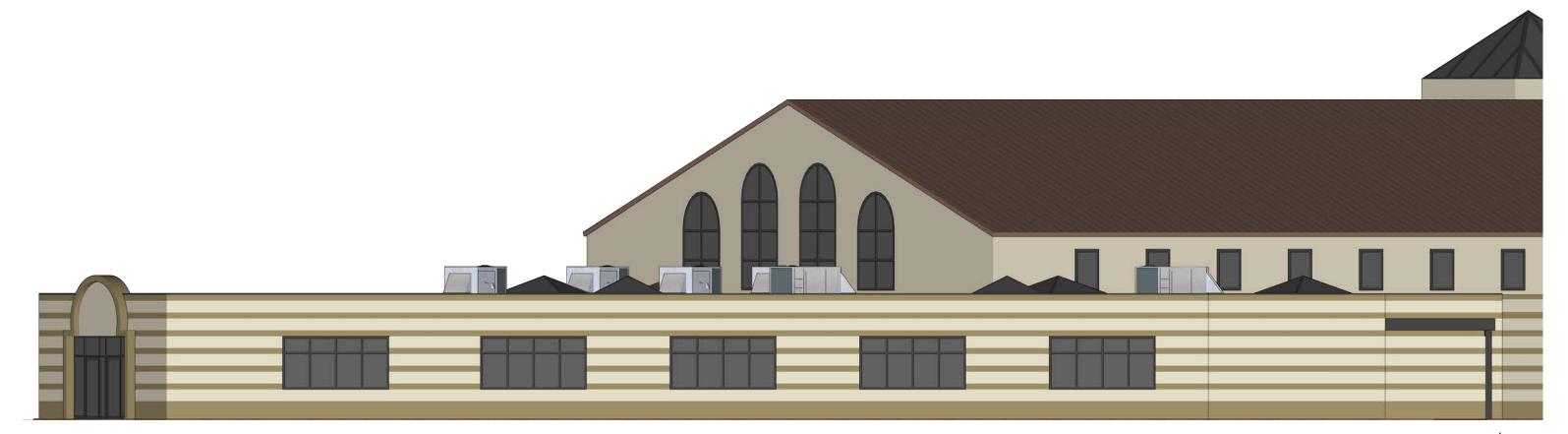

DEVELOPER BACKGROUND

- Two special purpose entities formed to develop and hold the connected Heller and Keller Kohn former textile buildings: 2202 Superior LLC and RJL 2230 SA LLC.
- TurnDev is the developer, based out of Beachwood, Ohio.
- Project team led by Mr. Jon Pinney.
- The completed CrossCountry Mortgage HQ, and ongoing Shooters on the Water and Cleveland Police HQ redevelopment projects have been managed by TurnDev.





PROPERTY BACKGROUND

- Total square footage: 99,946 square feet between the two connected structures.
 - Heller Building (2202 Superior): \sim 57,820 sq. ft. across four stories. Constructed in 1911.
 - Keller Kohn Building (2230 Superior): \sim 42,126 sq. ft. across three stories. Constructed in 1912.
- SI-6: semi-industry zoning.
- Both structures were historically constructed as part of a textile building complex and have served various commercial and industrial uses over the years.

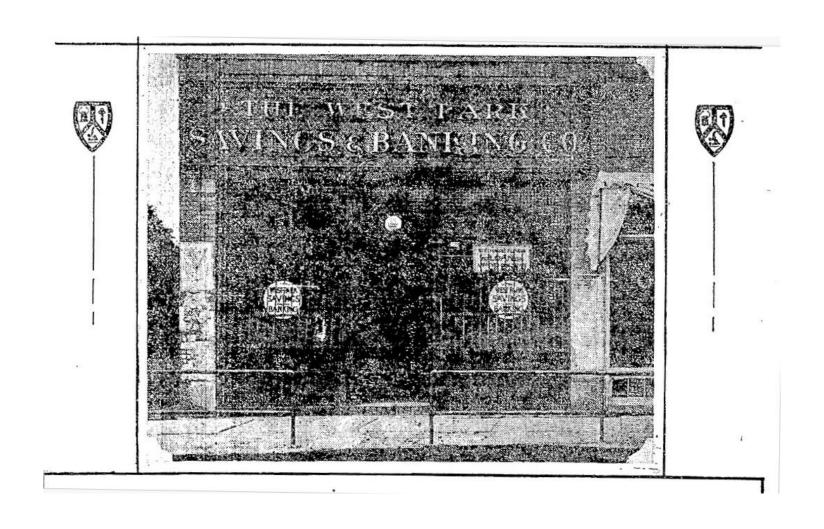
Kamm's Corners - 1912

Site Plan

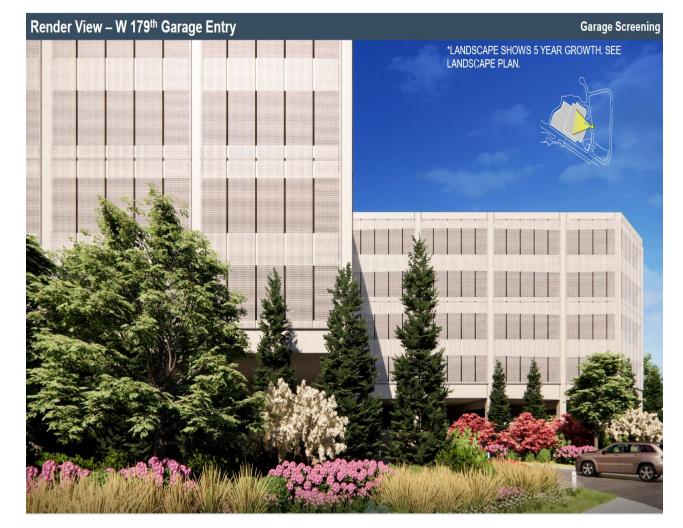

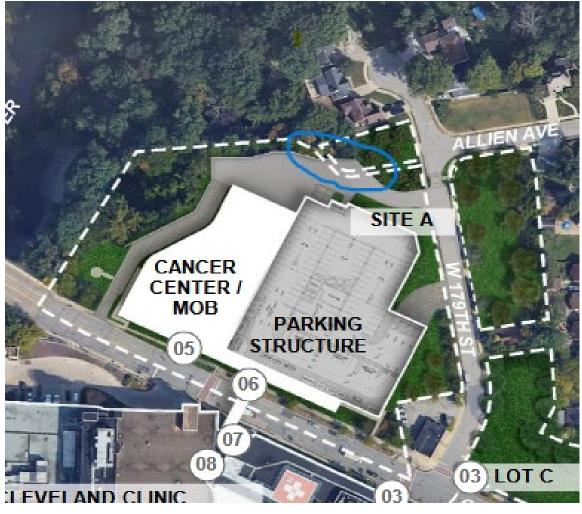
