Biography:

Henry Hradilek was born in Moravia, Austria-Hungary of Bohemian ancestors. He designed numerous single family homes in Cleveland Heights. He lived at 10712 Clifton Boulevard when he was drafted in the army during the First World War. During the War he was a member of Company A 308 Engineers. In 1930, he was living at 24763 Lake Road in Bay Village. He died at the U. S. Marine Hospital after a long illness. He is buried in Lakewood Park Cemetery.
