




About WRDSMTH






Background





North elevation: Note the demolition of the decorative Victorian brick chimneys including terra cotta chimney-pots. What remains of externally expressed brick chimney no longer makes any visual sense. (brick color added)

Photo taken Dec 17,2020 at 10:00 a.m. *before* the most important Victorian detailing was demolished.

At that same time the contractor depicted on porch steps (right) was speaking to owner and relaying the message that there was no proper exterior permit. And that he needed to contact the Landmarks Office before proceeding. The phone number of the Landmarks Office was stated at least twice.

A few days previous to this, Tim Barrett, a representative of concerned citizens had contacted the Landmarks Office and was told that only an interior permit existed, but there was none for any exterior work.

Several days later, after the owner had been informed about the lack of permit, no call had be received at the Landmarks Office. The demolition soon went forward.



It was the surface detail that expressed the Victorian Stick and Queen Anne style influences of this late 19c house.
